YMCA CAMP MASON

Child Protection Policy/Screening of Overnight Adult Guests

In accordance with YMCA Camp Mason's commitment to children's safety, we have adopted a policy for screening adult guests (age 18 and older) who visit Camp Mason with a school or other organization or group (each, a "group") for an overnight stay.* This policy provides another layer of protection for children visiting YMCA Camp Mason.

To comply with this policy, each group visiting YMCA Camp Mason, and whose program includes an overnight stay, will be asked to provide YMCA Camp Mason with the following:

A complete list of all adults who will be attending the program AND a letter on official letterhead signed and dated by the group leader indicated on the contract or other appropriate representative affirming that each such adult has been screened against the National Sex Offender Registry within the previous 12 months and cleared such screening.

In the absence of the above for any adults in the group, those adults will be required to do the following:

Produce a valid, government-issued photo ID (e.g., driver's license or passport card) at time of check in.**

YMCA Camp Mason staff will then scan the adult's identification using the RaptorWare® software screening system or another appropriate screening system adopted by YMCA Camp Mason at the direction of its CEO.

In the event the adult shows up on the National Sex Offender Registry, that adult will be asked to leave the YMCA Camp Mason property immediately.

If you have questions or concerns about this policy, please contact the organizer for your group's visit or the appropriate YMCA Camp Mason personnel.

The CEO of YMCA Camp Mason is directed and authorized to adopt appropriate procedures to implement this policy.

*This policy does not apply to family camp events.

**If any adult guests arrive separately from the main group check in, they must report to the Main Office for screening.
